The parts of the loom are like a mother with her twelve children, only twelve. See the loom as religious books,

See the raising of the heddle while weaving as ascending in this world after death,

See the lowering of the heddle while weaving as pushing all sin down with your feet,

That is good.

Hear the clap of the beater as the voice of Buddha reciting prayers, *That is good.* 

See the balls of weft passing from right to left as the lama's kettle that serves tea up and down the monastery hall,

That is good.

See the two pieces of the front roller as the wooden covers of a lama's religious book,

And you will grow. That is good.
