Green Tip of the Week: Purchase and use your own re-useable shopping bags. Why? Here are a few reasons: 14 plastic bags contain petroleum to drive a car one mile. 380 million plastic bags are thrown away in the USA every year, and cities must spend up to 17 cents per bag for their disposal. Making a paper bag emits 70% more greenhouse gases than making a plastic bag, and they do not biodegrade in landfills due to lack of oxygen. Looking for some nice shopping bags? Both Orange Tree Imports on Monroe Street and Fair Indigo at Hilldale carry Envirosax, which roll up and snap closed, fitting easily in a purse or backpack.
