- 1. Kaddesh or Kiddush blessings for first drink of juice Blessed are You, Spirit of Life, Who creates the fruit of the vine
- 2. Karpas blessing of the green vegetable, parsley
 May the eating of the karpas renew us as springtime renews the earth.
 Praised are You, Spirit of Life, Who creates the fruit of the earth.
- 3. Maggid Story-telling

The Four Children

- 1. The first child asks: "Why should I be concerned with the rest of humanity?" *Group*: "If you are only for yourself, what are you?"
- 2. The second child asks: "When there is so much suffering and oppression in the world, how can I selfishly be concerned with myself and my family?"


Group: "If you are not for yourself, who will be for you?"

3. The third is so overwhelmed by the magnitude of the problems in the world that s/he doesn't know where to begin, and so does nothing, not even ask.

Group: "It is not up to you to complete the task, but neither are you free to desist from it. If not now, when?"

- 4. The fourth child asks: "What can I do to help everyone?" Group: "We must act toward transformation of society. But the first step is to gain an understanding of the society and our position in it, which is what we are trying to do today, with this Freedom Seder "
- 4. Barech Blessing after the meal and before taking the third drink of juice Blessed are You, Spirit of Life, Who creates the fruit of the vine.
- 5. Blessing before fourth drink of juice
