#### **Interweave Collection for Trans Youth**

Cruel laws banning best-practice gender-affirming care have passed in 26 states across the country – thankfully, not yet in Wisconsin. Thousands of transgender youth and their families are being forced to identify new healthcare providers, travel extreme distances, and take on significant expenses just to get the care they need.

Continuing through the end of March, Interweave (Prairie's group for LGBTQ+ folks and allies) is collecting funds to donate to the Trans Youth Emergency Project, which helps families navigate care, offering logistical and financial support.
