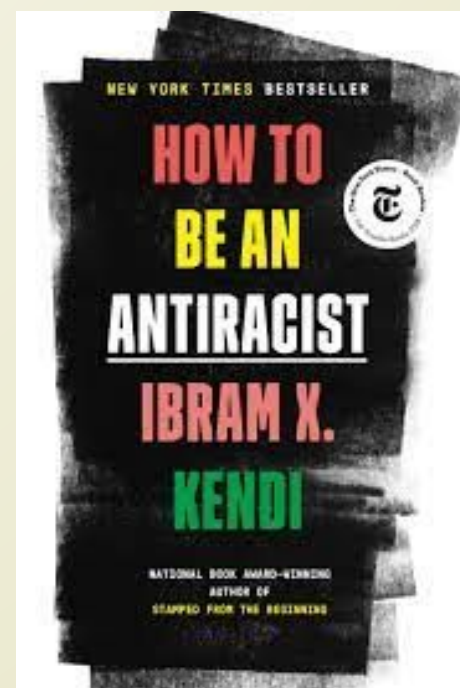

May 9th Congregational Meeting

On 12/8/19 & 1/26/20, the Congregation voted for the Search Committee to search for, vet and bring to the Board/Congregation a full time 1 year contract Minister. Search began meeting in January of 2020 (sometimes weekly). We sent out and analyzed the responses to a Congregational Survey. We used these responses to complete our Congregational Record (aka job posting) and this was posted in March 2020. Then covid19 happened and Search recommended pausing the Search process.

We reconvened in the summer of 2020. In September, we brought the UUA's Beyond Categorical Thinking workshop & service to Prairie. We then re-posted our Congregational Record in December and began receiving applications in January.

The spring moved quickly with conducting virtual interviews (questions based on responses from the Congregational Survey), watching recorded services, completing reference checks with multiple references, reading through their websites and extensive application packets.

We found a recommended candidate which the Board approved on Saturday April 17th and then according to our bylaws the Congregation will need to vote on.

Please see the email sent to Members on Monday April 19th and join us on Sunday May 9th 11:15am to discuss and vote. We have worked extremely hard and tirelessly to bring Prairie an excellent candidate.

I feel such a sense of hope these days. Vaccination rates are rising, covid rates in Wisconsin are falling, and spring has actually arrived. It feels like we're moving into a new period, and that has me looking back with appreciation at things I've learned and activities I've really enjoyed over the difficult winter that is now behind us.



Our Prairie community has been through a time of turmoil - the difficult decisions to remodel the building and to hire a full-time minister, a year of meeting off-site, the departure of our DRE Holly, the pandemic and our shift to all-virtual programming. I'm tired, but I can see the way through to the other side of many of those challenges. For many of us "white" people, the last year has also been a time to become more aware of the racism baked into our society and the dangers faced by people of color every day. Helping dismantle systemic racism is a challenge that we will be wrestling with for the rest of our lives.

And so will our children. When the ministerial candidate met with the RE committee last week, they talked about RE in UU congregations as a garden that nurtures the people who will fight for social justice in the future. We met another potential leader for Prairie recently, too. I'm happy to let you know that the RE committee has found a DRE who has a passion for social justice. A lifelong UU, they have been involved in youth justice work since their teen years. We're working our way through the final details. I hope by the time the next Prairie Fire comes out, they'll be on staff and helping us tend our RE garden that helps raise fair, brave, kind people. (I've used "they" here to avoid prematurely identifying our new DRE or our possible new minister, not because that's their pronoun).

After spending an hour or so on Zoom with each of these new people, I am struck by both of their commitment to inclusivity and to making it clear that our space is safe and welcoming for all. I think that showing each other and our children how to do that is one of the most powerful things our congregation can do. The RE committee hopes that Prairie will have the help of these two professionals to - in Biden's words - build back better as we start to gather again. Thank you to the search committee for all their careful work on our behalf, and to the members of the DRE hiring committee (Rebecca Strome, Lynn Currie, Carl Wacker, Jesse Garst, and me) for their varied expertise, and their Sunday afternoons.

Being together again in person will be wonderful. Many of us are vaccinated (Andy and I got our second shots today and will be considered "fully immunized" on May 5). But many of us are not vaccinated. The RE committee is working with the Board to develop a policy for unvaccinated members of our Prairie family, including all children under 16. Health and safety of our congregation and broader community, equal access for as many as possible, and quality of children's experience are all important considerations. I don't know what plan we'll land on, but I do know that I welcome input from all of you.

The first Sunday in June will be our Bridging service, honoring our young people who are moving on to a new stage in life - middle school to high school, preschool to kindergarten - as well as all of us who are (we hope) moving toward a new normal full of togetherness. Let me know if you or a family member are crossing an important bridge this year.

Hearts Tell a Story

What you don't find when you clean out the basement! A flood of memories flowed from the discovery of three displays created by Prairie folks on July 17, 2005, and carried in the Madison Pride Parade that afternoon. There in the basement, preserved in 3-D living color, were the hearts on which members wrote reasons they supported gay relationships and gay marriage.



The newly-discovered hearts were made all the more poignant by the fact that several of the writers are no longer with us due to taking on their adult lives, moving or moving on to other things, or transitioning to the great beyond.



This display alone contains statements from nine people no longer at Prairie. In the top row: Emma (age 8) and Caleb (age 5) Swartz and Kris (age 40) Long, Rowen (age 9) and Corrine (age 40) Hornbeck, all of whom have either grown up, moved on, or moved away. In the second row, Jean Matos and Mike Briggs (second and fourth hearts) have died. Third row, middle and right hearts, Lawrence Nahlik lives in Thailand, and Sarah Lord has moved on to other things.

Paula Pachciarz carries the Prairie Society banner while Patty Stockdale holds one of the heart displays in the Madison Pride Parade on July 17, 2005, the same day that the heart displays were created.



Some of the reasons, as articulated by Anne Urbanski, now living in Santa Fe, NM, but still participating in the Prairie Women's Group, Norma Briggs, deceased 4-30-2015, and Paula Pachciarz, current member.
