

FEBRUARY- *Behind the Kitchen Door* by Saru Jayaraman, led by Katrina Thompson



Daisey Hernandez and Bushra Rehman, self-described as a "Catholic Cuban-Colombian girl from New Jersey" and a "Pakistani Muslim girl from Queens," offer various perspectives--their own and others--of life lived as young feminists of color, exploring commonalities and cultural differences and examining macho cultures and American capitalism. The essays explore four major themes: family and community; mothers; cultural customs; and talking back to white feminists, men, mothers, liberals, and others. These women express a more radical, racialized feminism that broadens the movement beyond its early incarnation. *Vanessa Bush*

Looking back and looking ahead...



The changing of the calendar invites moments of reflection of where we've just been, along with imaginings of where our adventures might take us in the future.

It's hard to believe I've been with you for 6 months already. This first stretch has been spent primarily developing relationships and just listening. While this process is far from over, my hope is that we have begun to build a solid foundation of relational trust-the key ingredient for success in any human endeavor.

So hang on, because while the ride of beloved community may be bumpy at times I do believe the journey will always be worth it. In fact...it's safe to say that the work we will be doing together in the coming years is the critical work of our times.

As we look forward in this emerging year, may we commit to practices that will help us live more fully into the democratically developed, ever-evolving principles of this noble (and admittedly imperfect but designed to continually get better!) faith tradition.


30 Days of Love


