If You're Facing a Draft...

(Ed. note: the following material is excerpted from a brochure published by the Committee Against Registration and the Draft, 731 State Street, Madison, WI 53703, phone: 257–7562)

If you or someone you know is of draft age, you should be aware of the speed

with which military conscription could be re-established in this country. It has been estimated that the first draftees would be arriving at boot camp within thirteen days (Yes—13 days!) after Congress approved the action. The Selective Service says that it can deliver 100,000 draftees to the military within 30 days. The options today are somewhat different than they were during the Vietnam era.

You could try for CO status.
You could try for exemption or deferment.
You could look for asylum.
You could refuse Draft Orders.
You could refuse to Register.
Get Involved!

Join an anti-draft group, form a peace group, call or write your state and federal representatives opposing the war and the draft. Write your local newspaper or call a radio show and speak your mind. For further information and a referral to a draft counselor, contact the organization above.
