

UPCOMING PROGRAMS

September 22

"Criminal Justice" Esther Heffernan

Sister Heffernan is coordinator of the Criminal Justice program at Edgewood College, and professor in the Department of Social Science. She is also a consultant for the Alaska Department of Corrections and Federal Bureau of Prisons in the use of co-corrections. Sister Heffernan has recently finished a published history of women in federal corrections.

In Wisconsin, Heffernan has served as a member of the Legislative Council Committee examining the criminal code and other correctional issues, testified on correctional problems before the legislature, and has also appeared on a number of talk shows dealing with correctional issues.

"Virtual Chicken Soup" Bob Dopp

Bob will share with us his personal journey through the Internet in search of cures for cancer, on-line chatting with widows and widowers, and using electronic mail as a form of therapy. This program is the first in a series on informational technology coordinated by Lay Minister Al Nettleton..

"Virtual Medical Records"
Judy Faulkner, president of
EPIC Data Systems

Ms. Faulkner will talk about electronic medical records for managed care and integrated community health networks. Epic is a supplier of systems to some of the largest health care providers, and Judy has some unique insights on the role of automation in health care and the impact on the quality of medical care. How have you felt excluded in your life? How did you learn about sexual orientation? What do you fear about participating in this series of services? "What We Know and How We Learned It"

Participate in a word association brainstorm and share your feelings about the process and your reactions to the word lists with a partner. Then discuss "Twenty Questions About Homosexuality" with a small group. Don't worry if you haven't read "Twenty Questions." You may skim a few of the questions and answers right during the service. (Next reading assignment, "Homophobia: A Weapon of Sexism," may be picked up at the end of the service.)

October 27 (Young people especially invited!)

"Gender Socialization and Homophobia"

After a guided memory of your own same-sex friendships, small same-sex groups will recall the "rules" for fitting in with their own gender group and discuss what individuals had to do in junior high and high school to avoid being called "queer." The Welcoming Congregation

Lay Ministry Begins October 12

The Welcoming Congregation is a recognition of UUA congregations that have taken

the 15 actions that make a congregation feel welcoming to lesbians, gay men, and bisexuals. While Prairie long ago took some of these actions, and generally thinks of itself as the ultimate friend to a diverse population, Prairie is not officially a Welcoming Congregation; and it, as well as nearly every other congregation and every individual within our group, can be more welcoming.

One measure of how welcome gays, lesbians, and bisexuals feel is the number of us presently attending Prairie regularly. This number has drastically declined since the James Reeb Church opened its doors with lesbian minister Jonalu Johnstone and many gay and lesbian members and since First Unitarian began to take specific actions to become more welcoming in the past few years.

The Welcoming Congregation lay ministry will offer every participant - straight, gay, or bisexual — opportunities to:

- learn more about homosexuality and homosexuals,
- · examine the roots of Homophobia in society and in ourselves,
- become familiar with what the Bible says about this topic, and, most of all.
- find ways to combat Homophobia at Prairie and wherever it raises its threatening head.

The lay ministry will be conducted in a workshop-like atmosphere during regular Sunday morning services. Reading materials and "assignments" will be available prior to many services to help participants prepare for or experience the topic of the day. Some services will be very appropriate for middle and high school students who will be especially invited to at least one service.

The opening workshop/service will be held at Prairie's annual Upham Woods retreat on Saturday, October 12. The lay ministry will continue at Prairie the two following Sundays. Other dates are yet to be scheduled.

Lay minister for the 8-service series is lesbian Mary Mullen who will be assisted by several other leaders. Leaders will be of various sexual orientations so that all those who attend services will feel validated in their own personal persuasion.
