Next Sunday, May 12th "Flower Ceremony" by Prairie

The Flower Ceremony is an annual ritual that celebrates beauty, human uniqueness, diversity, and community. Originally created in 1923 by Unitarian minister Norbert Capek of Prague, Czechoslovakia; the Flower Ceremony was introduced to the United States by Rev. Maya Capek, Norbert's widow.

In this ceremony, everyone in the congregation brings a flower. Each person places a flower on the altar or in a shared vase. The congregation blesses the flowers and they're redistributed. Each person brings home a different flower than the one they brought.

Afterwards, Prairie Men's Group will be hosting a free Pancake Brunch that everyone is welcome to attend.

Next Sunday in RE: Everybody, including children, is invited to bring a flower with them and select a different flower to take home, in our Flower Communion celebration of the beauty of diversity. When we go downstairs, we'll have age-group classes. No OWL workshops today. After the service, the Guys' Group is serving a Mother's Day pancake brunch!
